Eligible Pupils		Allocation	<p>Specialist PE teacher to teach PE: Years 2-6 receive a weekly PE session which is planned and delivered by the specialist PE teacher. This has ensured good progression of skills between year groups, raised expectations of what children can achieve and ensured that children are getting a very high standard of provision as identified in lesson observations.</p> <p>In addition she has set up an assessment system for PE using the milestones which class teachers now use.</p> <p>Feed Forward: To increase CPD opportunities for class teachers in PE and increase hours for Year 1 to benefit from specialist teaching.</p> <p>Hailsham Sports Cluster: Additional inter school matches, tournaments and coaching has been beneficial using Secondary School expertise and facilities. This has also meant less organisation time required for class teachers to put on provision across the cluster of schools.</p> <p>Feed Forward: To continue to be part of the alliance.</p> <p>Pro Direct Lunchtime Sports Club: 1.25 hours x 5 days a week lunchtime club organised by qualified sports coaches. This has enables children to get involved in extra sporting provision at lunchtime and offers organised activities for playtimes, which has a positive impact on behaviour.</p> <p>Feed Forward: To continue to fund lunchtime coaching sessions with Pro Direct.</p> <p>After school clubs: Pro Direct ran an after-school club to prepare children for inter-school team tournaments</p> <p>Feed forward: Continue with after school club run by Pro direct 1 x per week. Increase variety of sporting after-school clubs provided.</p> <p>PE Equipment: PE equipment purchased to enable teachers to widen the range of sports offered during PE sessions. Children have been able to develop new skills and show evidence of transferring skills across different sports.</p> <p>Feed forward: Purchase further range of equipment to enable children to learn an increased number of sports.</p> <p>House Teams: Development of house teams linked to sporting Olympic champions has raised the profile of sport for children and developed a sense of team work amongst the four teams. The collection of tokens and the introduction of the cup for the winning house has developed the inter-house teams in school and introduced more opportunities for competition within the school.</p> <p>Feed Forward: Further develop house teams and link to commitment tokens. Introduce termly inter-house competitions.</p>
